About the position

The new CRRRC Boys Varsity Coach can immediately impact and contribute to the future of the club. Start date is Sept 4, 2018 or earlier. This is a part-time, year-round position, but with potential for a full-time employment including additional leadership duties. In addition to coaching the boys varsity team, this position could be expanded for the right candidate who is willing and able to assume administrative duties, scheduling, travel arrangements, team communications, regatta entries, and responsibility for all programs & athletes.

Boys Varsity Coach Responsibilities

- Instruct rowers to develop proper technique
- Develop and implement strength and conditioning plan to help rowers achieve peak fitness potential
- Supervise and coordinate practices with an emphasis on safety
- Attend regattas to supervise athletes and manage equipment
- Coordinate with CRRRC Board, Junior Parent Council and other coaches to:
 - Ensure compliance with USRowing SafeSport guidelines
 - Plan team racing and training trips
 - maintain all rowing equipment, coaching launches, outboard motors, and associated rowing, coaching and safety equipment (Ergometers, CoxBoxes, PFDs megaphones, etc)
 - Prioritize equipment use and needs
 - Recruit athletes from local schools to increase size and competitiveness of the team
 - Support fundraising initiatives and develop new fundraising sources as needed
 - Attend monthly Board meetings
 - Plan events and make team travel arrangements
 - Support, and integrate collaboration among all CRRRC rowing programs

A successful candidate will

- Foster a culture of respect, safety, empowerment and sportsmanship
- Model a strong work ethic and enthusiasm about the sport of rowing
- Motivate rowers to work together to achieve success

- Communicate well with all stakeholders (staff, board members, athletes, parents, volunteers, community members)
- Obtain CPR and First Aid certification within two weeks of employment (fees paid for by CRRC)
- Completion of a criminal background check
- Hold a valid drivers license

Desired experience

- Rowing or coxing experience at the high school, collegiate or national team level, required. Competitive collegiate career preferred.
- Successful coaching experience at the junior or collegiate level preferred
- Completion of USOC Safe Sport certification (prior to first day)
- USRowing Level 1 certification (preferred)
- Ability to drive the truck and shell trailer to regattas and training sites when required

Time Commitment

- The team practices M-F, 4-6:30 pm and Saturday 7-9 am during spring and fall rowing seasons. Practices M-F, 4-6 pm during winter months, with December break. Summer practices 6-8 am, M-F.
- Week-long spring training trip to Tennessee
- Four regattas during spring season. Four or five regattas during fall season. Qualifying rowers compete at the Head of the Charles.
- Additional time required for coordination with parents, other coaches, the club Board and committees.
